Brayden Button, filling in for student representative, Shelby Osgood, reported to the Board that Homecoming is fast approaching. Student council is very busy with preparing for it. Homecoming is October 2nd through October 6th. On Sunday, October 1, there will be a powerpuff game at the High School. Student council will be holding a carnival again this year that is open to the public on Wednesday, October 4th at 5:00 – 7:30 PM. The bonfire is right after the carnival. The parade is on Friday, October 6th at 5:00 PM. The Game is also on Friday, the 6th, against Cowanesque Valley. National Honor Society is collecting donations during tutorial from Monday, September 11 – 15. All monies collected will go to the American Red Cross to help those affected by Hurricane Harvey and Hurricane Irma. Whichever tutorial receives the most amount of money will get a pizza party. NHS is also hosting a blood drive on October 24. FFA are decorating the corn stocks on Main Street on Wednesday, September 13th. They will also be sending five freshmen and 4 officers to the FLC

(Fall Leadership Conference) on October 2nd. On September 20, they will be going on a poultry barn tour. On September 22nd, there will be a college fair at Mansfield University and seniors will be attending.

Elementary Principal Steve Adams reported that their STEM Program started on September 11th in 4th Grade. We have two community members helping – Rachael Smith and Melina Moyer. Mr. Adams also mentioned that our students stop whatever they are doing and honor the Flag wherever and whenever the Star Spangled Banner (our national anthem) is played. He witnessed a sports team stopping practice to listen to the anthem as well as other students who were just there.

Middle School Principal Mike Pietropola reported that the Middle School is off to a good start! CDT/Study Island benchmark assessments are just about done for students in Grades 5-8 in both Math and ELA and 8th Grade Science. Middle School will be offering tutoring to those students in need beginning September 18 and will run from 3:00 – 4:00 PM Monday – Thursday. Open House went well even with the change of schedule due to the weather!

Federal Programs Coordinator/Director of Curriculum & Instruction advised the Board that there isn't money in Title 1 for tutoring this year due to a \$50,000 decrease in funding. Because of the State Budget not being completed as yet, we are not sure if there will be tutoring monies from the Ready to Learn Grant. We use the majority of the funding to pay for two full day kindergarten teachers. Last year our Ready to Learn Allocation was \$219,000.

High School Principal Rob Kreger stated it was a great start to the school year at the High School. The students' welcome by teachers and administrators is always a hit. He invited board members to come tour the high school anytime.

Supervisor of Special Education Amy Repard welcomed Jake Rogers, School Psychologist and Chelsey Rendos, Speech & Language Impaired Therapist to the District. They fit right into our team! She stated that the District has two vacancies for part-time paraprofessionals.

Director of Buildings & Grounds Daren Bryant stated that it is that time of year again! The Maintenance Team is inspecting all the boilers and prepping to turn the heat back on. This always proposes a few challenges. Work Orders continue being completed. The Grounds Team has continued to be busy with keeping up with the grass. This mowing season has been relentless compared to most. They are also getting geared up and ready to apply the annual fall grounds treatment. We have added a top coating of screens to the pathway down to the football field. This has given the pathway a lot more stability. We are continuing to work on a long term plan in the upcoming spring.
